In partnership with Archaeology Southwest, the Coalition published a report on the threat of oil and gas development on the cultural landscapes, ancestral homelands, and sacred sites of Tribes within and adjacent to national park lands. Advocacy Actions

Below is a summary of actions we took in August:

- Coalition Vice Chair Don Hellmann was joined by Janae Field, Executive Director of the Frontera Land Alliance, in a virtual webinar for Congressional staff to discuss the importance of conservation. A <u>recording</u> of the
- The Coalition joined the Southern
 Environmental Law Center in
 <u>comments</u> supporting the U.S. Fish and
 Wildlife Service's proposed revisions to
 regulations governing the
 reintroduction of experimental
 populations of threatened and
 endangered species. The Coalition also
 joined numerous organizations in a
 <u>letter</u> expressing support of Secretary
 Haaland's order phasing out the use of
 single use plastics, while making
 recommendations for additional steps
 to further that goal.
- Chair Mike Murray coauthored an <u>op-ed</u> with Theresa Pierno of the National Parks Conservation Association highlighting projects successfully funded by the *Great American Outdoors Act* (GAOA). They also highlighted the need for Congress to extend funding and commit to fixing more parks. Additionally, the Coalition published a new <u>blog post</u> commemorating the second anniversary of GAOA.
- We issued a <u>press release</u> celebrating passage of the *Inflation Reduction Act*, which supports NPS staffing to monitor and respond to the impacts of climate change, as well as makes meaningful and needed reforms to the oil and gas leasing process.
- Coalition members have been successful highlighting both troubling issues and achievements of the NPS in the media. Mark Butler's <u>opinion piece</u> in the Los Angeles Times discussed protecting parks from the increasing threat of wildfire. Linda Mazzu <u>celebrated</u> Bryce Canyon's dark sky recognition in honor of Global Sleep Under the Stars Day.
