Concern Over Air Quality and Regional Haze

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) put forward a plan years ago to tackle haze pollution, but it was fairly weak. While the EPA initially pushed back, they've now proposed to approve that flawed plan. This decision lets polluters in Texas and Oklahoma off the hook for reducing the emissions that cause haze.

If you're as concerned as we are, please sign this <u>letter</u> to oppose the EPA's decision.

The deadline to sign is Monday, July 21, 2025.

Advocacy Issues and Actions

Below are highlights from the Coalition's work in June:

- In a big win, efforts to sell off millions of acres of public lands were dropped from a Senate bill thanks to widespread <u>bipartisan</u> <u>opposition</u>, including efforts by the Coalition.
 During this difficult yet crucial
- moment, the Coalition has successfully drawn <u>public media</u>
 <u>interest</u> and highlighted the critical need to protect our parks and public lands. While the work continues, we've compiled some of our recent communications efforts at the link.

 The Coalition joined partners in a
- <u>letter</u> sent in strong opposition to the proposed rule by the Office of Personnel Management that would undermine 140 years of civil service protections, potentially leading to the politically motivated dismissal of thousands of NPS employees and jeopardizing the management of our national parks.
 The National Parks Second Century
- Action Coalition is urging Congress to reject the President's proposed \$1.2 billion cut to the NPS, warning it would be the largest in history and severely undermine the parks' ability to protect our natural and historical treasures.
