Below are highlights from the Coalition's work in July:

- We released a report in partnership with the SEEC Institute, outlining how climate change is reshaping the National Park System and proposing actionable solutions to safeguard them.

- The Coalition, in partnership with NPCA, ANPR, and PEER, released a new <u>analysis</u> detailing the realworld consequences of further staffing cuts, from slashed visitor services and delayed maintenance to weakened wildfire response and threats to cultural and natural resource protection.
- The Coalition continued to track the FY 2026 appropriations process, <u>warning</u> that the House Appropriations Bill would decimate parks and programs and deepen an existing crisis.
