Government Shutdown

We remain deeply concerned about the impacts of this ongoing government shutdown on our NPS employees and our national parks. Keeping parks open without adequate staffing puts resources and visitors at risk.

If our government is closed, than our parks should be too. Thank you for joining our <u>letter</u>, signed by over <u>450</u> <u>former NPS employees</u>, urging Secretary Burgum to close our parks during this shutdown.

In addition, thousands of NPS employees are working - or on furlough - without pay. We continue to push Congress to reopen the government with adequate funding and staffing for our parks and public lands.

Advocacy Issues and Actions

- The Coalition joined the National Parks Conservation Association in submitting <u>comments</u> on the NPS effort to improve visitor services. The comments emphasized that, "without bolstering the ranks of the park service employees, the visitor experience will be severely degraded."
- Additionally, we submitted formal comments regarding the proposed rescission of the Bureau of Land Management's Conservation and Landscape Health Rule, urging the BLM to retain and/or revise-and-retain many portions of the Public Lands Rule, rather than rescind ALL of it.
- We issued a <u>statement</u> with partners, expressing deep concern over Senator Lee's new bills that would open national parks to offroad vehicles (ORVs), fundamentally altering the visitor experience and damaging landscapes that draw millions of visitors each year.
- The Coalition signed on in opposition to S. 1462, the "Fix Our Forests Act" (FOFA). Many of the forest management provisions eliminate science from decision-making and undermine environmental and public engagement laws. These provisions of the bill represent the antithesis of effective, science-based wildfire mitigation and offer false solutions that would harm communities, ecosystems, and biodiversity.

On the Horizon

- Continued outreach to media and Congressional offices on the government shutdown and impacts to parks, public lands, and NPS employees.
- Ongoing advocacy and education surrounding the impacts of federal workforce cuts on the National Park System.
- Building partnerships at the Historic New England Summit in Connecticut.
- Support for the extension of the Great American Outdoors Act (America the Beautiful Act).
